Introducing the Trust

South West London and St George's Mental Health NHS Trust was formed in 1994. The Trust operates from a number of locations and is responsible for providing all community and hospital psychiatric services to the communities of Kingston, Merton, Richmond, Sutton and Wandsworth. The Trust also offers more specialist services to people throughout the United Kingdom.

The Trust works in partnership with colleagues in primary care, local authorities and the non-statutory sector to promote mental health and improve awareness of its importance; support people with mental health problems and their families; provide care and treatment to the highest standards and help schools and employers challenge stigma.

Our Vision

To play a major role by providing safe, effective, personal services within the resources available, in a future in which people with mental health problems have the same opportunity as other citizens to participate and contribute to our communities.

Our Values

The most important people in our services are those who use them and their relatives, friends and carers. The most important resources that we have are the staff that provide their care and support.

In all our actions we will recognise the value and diversity that exists in our services and our local community and strive to ensure equality of access, experience and outcome irrespective of race or ethnicity, disability, age, gender, sexuality or religious belief, or place of residence.

We will treat everyone with dignity and respect, involve them in decisions that affect them and provide them with whatever information they feel will help them. In all we do we strive for excellence, equality and the efficient use of resources.

Our Purpose

The Trust recognises that everyone with mental health problems faces the challenge of retaining or recovering a life that is as meaningful, satisfying and valued as possible.

The purpose of the Trust is to help people with mental health problems to do the things they want to, live the lives they want to live and access those opportunities that all citizens should take for granted. To achieve this purpose we will work in partnership with those who use services, their relatives, carers and friends, and other stakeholders to:

- Foster hope in those whom we service and do our best to ensure that everyone's experience of using our service is a positive one
- Provide effective treatment and help people to take back control over their problems and their lives and the help they receive
- Improve people's life chances by promoting their health, safety and wellbeing and assisting them to access the opportunities that they value: home, jobs, friends, relationships, education, social pursuits, leisure activities, spiritual possibilities
- Undertake teaching, clinical audit and research, to enable us to continue to do this work for those who will use our services in the future
- Cultivate a workforce that is committed to pursuing our vision and purpose and ensure they have the support and development opportunities they need to do so

Our Legal Status

The Trusts Establishment Order is Statutory Instrument (SI) 1994 No.3178 which defines the nature and functions of the Trust as:

- (1) The Trust is established for the purposes specified in Section 5 (1)(a) of the Act [National Health Service and Community Care Act 1990]
- (2) The Trust's functions (which include functions which the Secretary of State considers appropriate in relation to the provision of services by the Trust for one or more health authorities) shall be –
 - (a) to own and manage hospital accommodation and services provided at Springfield Hospital, 61 Glenburnie Road, London, SW17 7DJ and associated hospitals (Including the management of its teaching and research facilities);
 - (b) to manage community health services provided from Springfield Hospital, 61 Glenburnie Road, London, SW17 7DJ and to own the associated premises
