Plans submitted for the new hospital at Springfield

We are pleased to confirm that following our three-day public consultation in September 2017, a planning application has now been submitted to Wandsworth Council for the new hospital buildings at Springfield University Hospital.

The new hospital, which is a key part of the wider regeneration at Springfield, will be delivered in two buildings to the rear of the Grade II Listed main building and link with the existing Storey building which houses three acute mental health wards.

The Trust welcomes the level of support received for the detailed hospital plans and we look forward to working with the community to deliver these state-of-the-art mental healthcare facilities in South West London.

Our preferred development partner STEP



In September we announced the selection of STEP (Springfield and Tolworth Estate Partnership) as our preferred master developer to deliver the Estate Modernisation Programme.

STEP is a 50/50 partnership between Kajima Partnerships and Sir Robert McAlpine Capital Ventures. They have significant experience in delivering both high-quality medical facilities and masterplan developments.

Importantly, STEP is committed and looks forward to working with the community, local stakeholders and the Trust to bring forward the new state-of-the-art mental healthcare hospital buildings alongside the wider regeneration plans which include the 32-acre Springfield Park.

Springfield Village

The comprehensive masterplan for the site, which is being referred to as Springfield Village, will become a vibrant community where healthcare facilities are integrated with new community, residential and commercial uses - helping to remove the stigma attached to mental health treatment.

What is next?

The Trust intends to submit a Full Business Case for the EMP to the Government for approval in January 2018. Development of the site will begin following the approval, which is expected in Spring/Summer 2018.

We are excited to confirm that the first stages of the masterplan delivery will include the Springfield Park alongside the new hospital, thereby ensuring continuity of use for the Trust's service users and staff.

Building on the approved Park Strategy and the detailed consultation undertaken in 2015, STEP is progressing detailed plans for Springfield Park and will be coming forward with a public consultation in January 2018.

The plans follow the principles established by the approved Park Strategy, which was informed by over 80 hours of direct engagement and 1,900 responses from stakeholders, local groups, service users and residents.

Meet the team and have your say

The Trust and STEP are committed to keeping the community updated as the plans for Springfield progress.

The next stage of consultation on Springfield Park and main site infrastructure will be taking place in January 2018. This will also be an opportunity for local residents to meet members of the STEP team and find out more about the wider masterplan.
